I am pleased to provide this Annual Report for the South Haven Scott Club year ending June, 30, 2022. In spite of the pandemic and challenges that we faced recently, Scott Club is going strong and moving forward. The Scott Club continues to provide a wide range of cultural, literary and educational programs to the residents and visitors to South Haven and surrounding communities. All programming is free and open to all! Our all-volunteer organization of approximately 100 members has maintained its historically significant building known as “Literary Hall” for almost 130 years. The Climate and Ground Floor Renovation, completed in October, 2021, was part of a multi-year plan and brings building investment to \$93,000 over the past 3 years. Since Scott Club depends on donations and grants for a portion of operating expenses and all building improvements, this is a testament to the generous support of members and the community. I have had the honor of being president of a talented and committed executive board that has worked diligently to advance the mission of the Scott Club. Key Accomplishments:

Climate & Ground Floor Renovation Project replaced 30-year-old furnace, added air-conditioning, redesigned & replaced ductwork, upgraded electrical and completed a variety of repairs. Completed: Oct, 2021. Cost: \$59,825. Planned Accessibility Improvement Project, scheduled for Nov, 2022 through Feb, 2023. Estimated cost: \$47,000.
